ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUG MANAGEMENT PLAN (AODMP)

Long-term Outcome: To reduce and prevent the impact of alcohol and other drug related harm and problems in the Shire of Exmouth

Endorsed: 18/09/2018

PURPOSE

Exmouth's Local Drug Action Team (LDAT) is committed to reducing the impact of alcohol and other drug problems in Exmouth. The Exmouth Alcohol and Other Drug Management Plan seeks to reduce the impact of alcohol and other drug problems by minimising harm. The plan guides the need for:

- Partnerships between local government, community and service providers, nominating one organisation with the capability to govern, auspice, lead and enact change. All partners are intent on aligning with the plan with the ability to deliver prevention projects.
- Local need provides a means to coordinate, implement and evaluate an evidence-based, whole of community approach in a timely and appropriate manner that understands community needs.
- Community involvement committed to a community owned approach, which can reach community, conducted with community consultation or engagement.

PRIORITY AREAS

- 1. Address the community culture and normalisation of AOD use in Exmouth
- 2. Educate the community on the AOD support services that are available to minimise harm associated with AOD use in Exmouth
- 3. Educate the community around the negative impacts of AOD use in Exmouth

BACKGROUND

Alcohol and other drug problems have health, social and financial impacts on the Exmouth community. As well as the direct impacts on individuals and families, the community as a whole is affected. The harms from alcohol and other drug problems include health impacts, risky behaviours, violence and other criminal activities. Harms also include social, family and financial problems as well as the impact on the capacity to parent and child wellbeing.

The Exmouth AODMP was developed using best practice principles (see appendix 1).

Two regional AOD planning workshops involving the Mental Health Commission and key Exmouth AOD stakeholders (December 2017 and February 2018) have provided the context for the Exmouth Alcohol and Other Drug Management Plan (AODMP). These documents reflect the collective knowledge and experience of the Exmouth AOD planning workshops and should be consulted if further development of the AODMP is required. 
The Exmouth AODMP is a two-year plan. However, there may be cases where strategy and key priority areas will adopt some variation according to emerging trends in the community.

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APPENDIX 1

PLANNING FOR AN EFFECTIVE PLAN

Creating a sustainable reduction in alcohol and other drug related harm is a complex and long-term process. Issues can be overwhelming and perceived as too difficult to address at a local level. However, with some effective planning, it's at the local level where partnerships between communities and services can have the greatest impact.

Prior to establishing and implementing an alcohol and other drug management plan (AODMP), a number of steps need to happen to ensure the resulting plan has been developed in partnership to reflect the communities needs and has the best chance at creating sustainable change.

It is important that the community have a strong understanding of the issues and have ownership of the strategies developed to address them. To ensure this, processes should be put in place that allow community input into all stages of the development and implementation of the AODMP, including progress made against addressing the issues.
