Service workers housing project underway

Earthworks are about to begin at the site of Exmouth's Service Worker Housing Project in Lefroy Street.

The affordable housing project was initiated by the Shire of Exmouth in response to local concerns that the high cost of housing was making it difficult for businesses to attract and retain workers. This was particularly evident in areas such as retail, hospitality and trades, which play a vital role in supporting Exmouth's tourism industry and providing services to local residents.

Following extensive negotiations with the State Government and the Department of Housing, the Shire rezoned land on Lefroy Street to clear the way for the Department to move forward with the project.

Once completed, the Service Worker Housing will provide 20 accommodation units including 12 single bedroom,

six two bedroom and two three bedroom homes. The one and two storey dwellings will be leased to local businesses with rents determined by the income of the worker.

A management committee with representatives from the Department of Housing, Shire of Exmouth and local business will determine the eligibility criteria and conditions for businesses leasing the homes.

Earthworks are expected to start in January and be completed within six to eight weeks. Department of Housing tenders for construction of the dwellings will be finalised soon and the homes to be finished by July 2016.
