SUGGESTED THINGS TO CONSIDER FOR THE WRITING OF MEMORIES

Maximum 200 words a page.

- What were your feelings and thoughts during the period of going into lockdown and then coming out of stage three of government restrictions imposed because of this COVID-19 health crisis (from 15 March to 26 June 2020)?
- Where did you mostly spend your time during this period and what activities did you do?
- How did you communicate with your family and friends during this period?
- How were you affected during this period, and did you miss any of your usual day-to-day activities during this period?
- How did you feel about being able to live in Exmouth during this period when there were people in other states and around the world whose family and/or friends and/or people they knew caught the virus, and the fatally disastrous effect it has had so far on many people around the world, including some here in Exmouth?
- What thoughts and lessons have you learnt from this period that you could use in the future, if you were to be placed again in a movement restricted situation and/or lockdown because of a breakout of the COVID-19 virus?
