Have your say at October Council Elections

Exmouth's local government elections will be held on 21 October 2017 and Commissioner Ian Fletcher has called on all local residents to get involved and ensure Exmouth has strong leadership into the future.

Mr Fletcher encouraged members of the community to consider nominating for one of the six Council vacancies, and exercise their rights to vote.

He said the community had been through a difficult time following the Corruption and Crime Commission investigation and suspension and resignation of Council.

The Shire had worked incredibly hard to rebuild over the last eight months and now it was time for the community to play its part and elect a new Council to lead the community.

"Exmouth has a very bright future and this is the time for anyone who is passionate about the future of the town to make a substantive contribution to the community by nominating for Council," he said. "For those who do not want to be Councillors, make sure you have a say on who will lead Exmouth into the future.

"That means making sure you are enrolled to vote and using that vote to elect a leadership that will deliver good governance into the future.

"It is time to move forward, it is time to be a part of the solution, it is time to act."

Mr Fletcher said the Shire would be hosting workshops on 29 August to explain the roles and responsibilities of Councillors for anyone seeking more information. Elected Councillors would also be required to undergo training to ensure they understood the Local Government Act and were properly equipped to carry out the role of Councillor.

Frequently Asked Questions

When will the next local government election be held?

Local government ordinary elections are held every two years in October. The next ordinary local government election will be held on 21 October 2017.

Who is eligible to vote in local government elections?

People who own *or* occupy property within a local government district, are eligible to vote.

Enrolment is compulsory for all Western Australians who:

- Are aged 18 years and over;
- Are Australian Citizens; and
- Have lived at their current address for at least one month

You can check your enrolment details by contacting the Western Australian Electoral Commission on 08 9214 0400 or online at www.elections.wa.gov.au.

How do I register to be on the local government electoral roll?

All residents who are enrolled on the State Electoral Roll are automatically enrolled on the corresponding local government roll.

People who own *or* occupy property within the local government district can contact their local government to be included on the roll as an owner/occupier. To register for enrolment on the Shire of Exmouth roll contact the Shire on 9949 3000. Rolls close on 1 September 2017.

Who is eligible to nominate as a candidate in the local government election?

Under the *Local Government Act 1995* to be eligible to nominate as a candidate you must be a residential owner *or* occupier in the district and be over 18 years of age.

Will there be an information session for prospective Councillor candidates?

Yes. A Councillor information session will be held on 29 August 2017.

How do I nominate as a candidate for the local government election?

To nominate as a candidate a valid nomination must consist of:

- A completed nomination form
- A candidate profile (150 words maximum)
- An \$80 deposit
- A photograph (optional)

Nomination applications must be lodged with the Returning Officer by 4 pm on 14 September 2017.

Key dates for your calendar:

September 1, 2017—Close of rolls at 5pm. Make sure you are enrolled to vote before this date.

September 7, 2017—Nominations open. This is the first day for candidates to lodge completed nomination papers to the Returning Officer.

September 14, 2017—Nominations close at 4pm.

October 17, 2017—Last day for absentee votes and close of postal vote applications for voting in-person elections.

October 20, 2017—Close of early voting for in-person elections.

October 21, 2017—Election Day—Close of poll 6pm.
