Development of Operational Plans for Exmouth Groups

During August, nine Exmouth Clubs and Community Organisations took part in Club Planning Sessions over three nights. We were fortunate to have secured Kim Buttfield Consulting to present the sessions with the assistance of BHP and the Department of Local Government Sport and Cultural Industries. The intention of the sessions was for these organisations to develop their annual operational plans.

Formation of an Exmouth Local Drug Action Team (Exmouth LDAT)

In conjunction with the national Alcohol and Drug Foundation, a Local Drug Action Team (LDAT) has been formed to support a community such as Exmouth's to work together to prevent and minimise harm caused by alcohol and other drugs. The Exmouth LDAT has formulated a Community Action Plan (CAP) that provides a framework to address specific alcohol and other drug-related issues that have been identified.

Vietnam Veterans Day

On Tuesday 18 August, members of the Exmouth community and the Australian and United States service personnel in attendance remembered our Vietnam Veterans with a memorial service held at the Exmouth Cenotaph.

Gascoyne Outdoor Recreation Strategy

The Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries hosted a workshop in Exmouth on 11 August to review the draft Gascoyne Outdoor Recreation Strategy. The purpose of this strategy is to facilitate a regional approach for the provision of accessible, high-quality, outdoor recreation opportunities in the Gascoyne and to guide the development of infrastructure, programs, events, and services to support these opportunities.

EXHIBITION A collection of memories inspired by members of the Exmouth Community



This Exhibition will be scheduled for an opening later this year.

One of the purposes of the EXMOUTH REMEMBER WHEN COVID-19 MEMORIES 2020 EXHIBITION involves a community recovery component concerning a collection of memories of the COVID-19 pandemic restriction period that occurred in Exmouth from 15 March to 26 June 2020 by principally presenting photographs in frames hung in the Ningaloo Centre's Memory Room. Another purpose for the exhibition involves a mental health component about how people felt during this period which are reflected in the memories captured, such as displayed through the photographs taken. We know that a great number of people and places around the world have been, and are being, affected by the COVID-19 pandemic which will continue for some time into the future. We hope that through presenting a Memories 2020 Exhibition that this will assist us to reflect that this pandemic hasn't gone away but that we remember some of the things we did here in Exmouth during a period of national and state restrictions that affected our way of life. 
The EEYN is seeking to build on its membership by involving a broader base of community members, service providers and interested parents.
