EXMOUTH ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUGS COMMITTEE (EAODC)

Addressing alcohol and other drug related harm is a complex task that requires a number of strategies. The delivery of these strategies in a coordinated manner is essential if the activities are to have the desired impact in the community while being delivered within the existing resource availability. A committee (EAODC) was formed in 2018 that is comprised mainly of service providers from within Exmouth. Community input is essential if the EAODC is to provide feedback to appropriate local networks. As it has been two years since the formation of the EAODC, it is time to review the Terms of Reference for this committee.
