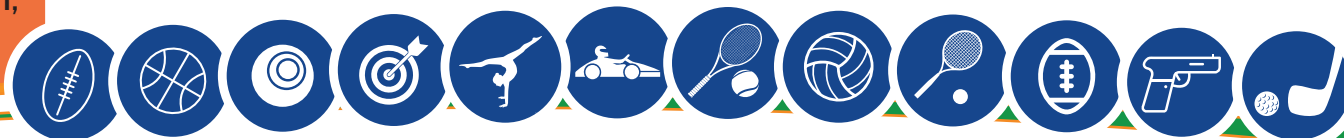

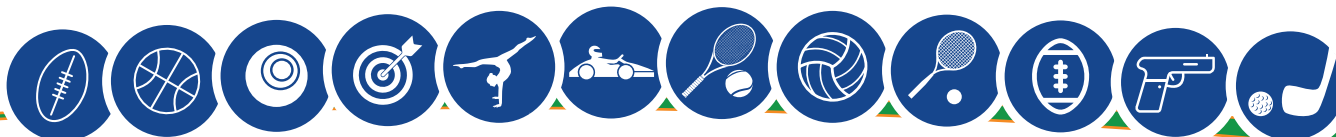

We look forward to enjoying the various sports competitions to be held throughout the weekend of these Games and the fond memories developed from the friendly rivalry encountered.

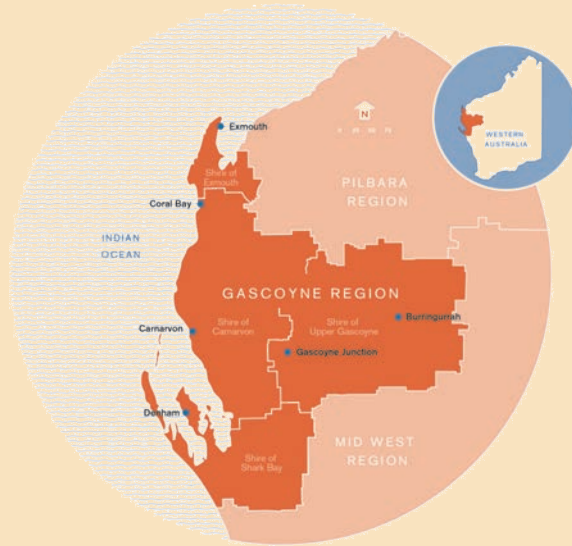
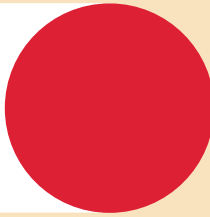

WHAT ARE THE GASCOYNE GAMES?



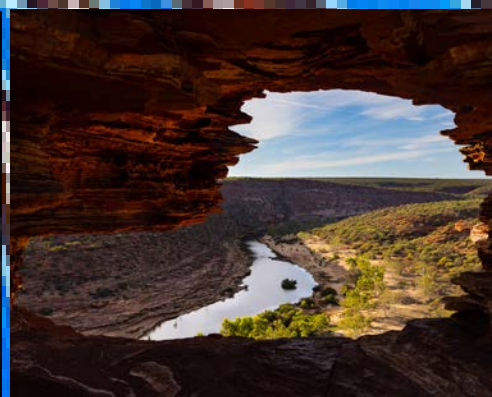

The word 'Gascoyne' in Gascoyne Games refers to the local government administrative regions of Carnarvon, Exmouth, Shark Bay and Upper Gascoyne.

In conjunction with the Western Australian Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries, the local governments in these regions have supported the concept of holding a multi-sport regional event.

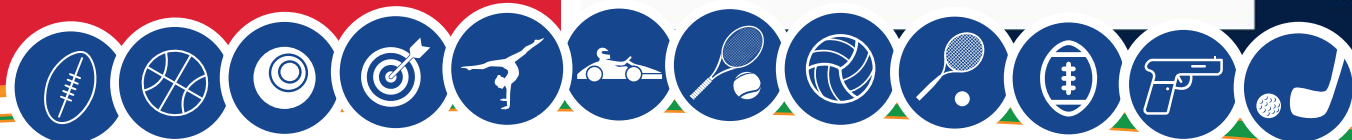
The 2021 Gascoyne Games will feature 12 sport disciplines involving more than 500 athletes from within and outside of the Gascoyne region. In holding the Games, the intention is to first build an intra-regional spirit of competition by providing sporting and developmental opportunities for players, support officials and technical officials through uniting the Gascoyne Region, and secondly to also build an inter-regional spirit of competition by inviting sports participants from other nearby regions to compete.

HISTORY



2021 GASCOYNE GAMES FACTS?

- D** Each Gascoyne Games is organised and hosted by a local government authority within the Gascoyne Region.
- D** The 2021 Gascoyne Games sees competitors attending from Carnarvon, Karratha, Paraburdoo, Port Hedland, Geraldton, Perth, Shark Bay, Newman, Mullewa, Wickham, Coral Bay and Exmouth.
- D** One of the teams entering the 2021 Gascoyne Games is the "Once We Were Warriors" Touch Football Team, who have entered the Games due to not being able to play in the 2021 Australian Masters Games which due to the world-wide COVID-19 pandemic has been postponed to 23 to 30 April 2022.
- D** It is thought, that with 12 competing sports in the 2021 Gascoyne Games, this year's event will be the largest Gascoyne Games held to date.
- D** The youngest competitor in the 2021 Gascoyne Games is aged five years and competing in Gymnastics.
- D** The oldest competitor in the 2021 Gascoyne Games is aged 72 years and competing in Darts.



HEAT STRESS



How to prevent heat-related illness!

- Never leave anyone in a locked car
- Drink plenty of water and fluids (note: if your doctor normally limits your fluids or you are on fluid tablets, you may need to check how much to drink while the weather is hot)
- Limit or avoid alcohol
- Always carry a water bottle when out
- Take a cool shower or bath
- Wear lightweight, loose-fitting clothing
- Apply sunscreen at regular intervals
- Use a spray bottle filled with water, or a wet cloth, to cool your face and body
- If possible, stay in shaded areas when outdoors
- Don't rely on fans unless there is adequate ventilation

Make sure you know the signs of heat stress:

- Muscle cramps
- Dizziness
- Headache
- Nausea
- Increased heart rate
- Sweating or no sweating with high temperature
- Hot, dry skin
- Fainting

If you experience any of the above severe symptoms seek urgent medical advice.

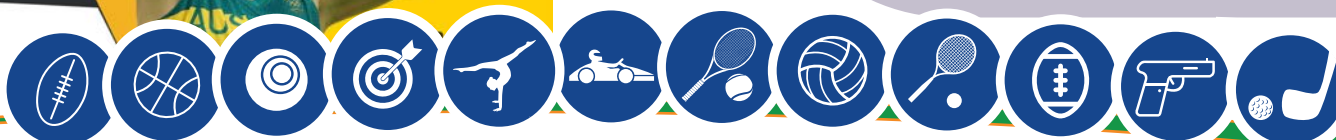
Natalie has been an Australian professional basketballer who played at the 2016 Olympics held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

Being SunSmart is about protecting skin and eyes from damaging UV radiation – especially when outdoors from September to April.



Slip on a shirt

Slip on a shirt with long sleeves. Fabrics with a tighter weave and darker colours will give you better protection from the sun.



Slip into the shade

Slip into the shade of an umbrella or a leafy tree. Plan your outdoor activities for early or later in the day when the sun's UV levels are lower.



Slop on sunscreen

Slop on plenty of broad spectrum sunscreen of at least SPF 30. Apply 20 minutes before going outside and reapply every two hours and especially after being in water or sweating.



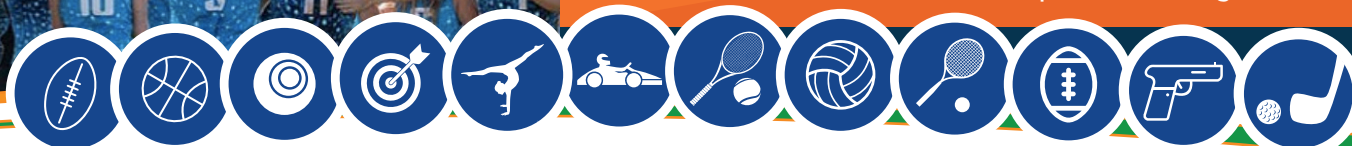
Slap on a hat

With a wide brim or a cap with flaps. More people are sunburnt on the face and neck than any other part of the body.



Wrap on sunglasses

Choose close fitting, wrap around style sunglasses. Not all sunglasses protect against UV radiation, so always check the label for sun protection rating.



PRINCIPLES OF FAIR PLAY – CODE OF CONDUCT

The Fair Play Code outlines a set of guiding principles on expected standards of behaviour for every person involved in the 2021 Gascoyne Games.

This includes every player, participant, coach, support person, official, administrator, club member, spectator, parent, volunteer or member of the public. All should demonstrate the principles of integrity, respect, responsibility, fairness and safety in relation to their sport and the Gascoyne Games by:

INTEGRITY

1. being honest, fair, respectful, trustworthy, reliable, open and transparent in dealings with others
2. avoiding any real or perceived conflicts of interest
3. striving to earn and sustain a high level of community trust and goodwill
4. not engaging in or advocating the possession and use of banned performance enhancing substances or methods, or illicit drugs
5. not participating in, or encouraging, action that may jeopardise the integrity of their sport.

RESPECT

1. treating everyone involved in their sport in a considerate, objective and courteous manner with proper regard for their rights, dignity and worth
2. refraining from any form of discrimination, harassment, bullying, abuse, child abuse, intimidation, victimisation or vilification of others, including on the basis of age, race, sex, disability, sexuality, gender identity or religion

3. recognising and valuing the contribution of all within their sport, including volunteer coaches, officials and administrators who give up their valuable time to make their sport and the Gascoyne Games happen.

RESPONSIBILITY

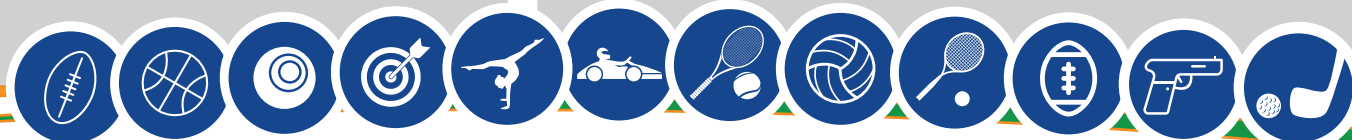
1. considering and accepting the consequences of one's actions and decisions
2. being a positive role model by displaying self-control, respect, care and diligence towards all involved with their sport and the Gascoyne Games
3. complying with specified child safe standards of conduct expected of adults when dealing and interacting with persons under 18 years of age
4. understanding the possible consequences of breaching the Fair Play Code and immediately reporting any potential breaches to appropriate authorities.

FAIRNESS

1. understanding and playing by the rules and spirit of their sport and the Gascoyne Games
2. being informed, consistent, impartial, just and reasonable in dealings with others
3. being a [good sport] by encouraging and praising fair play over winning at all costs
4. providing a [fair go] to people of all abilities to be involved in their sport and to reach their full potential.

SAFETY

1. providing a safe, welcoming and inclusive environment that places the health, welfare and well-being of participants above all else
2. taking all reasonable steps to ensure equipment, facilities and programs meet health and safety standards and are appropriate to the age and ability of participants
3. being aware of and supporting policies and practices in relation to injury management, return to play, adverse weather and child safe standards
4. showing concern and caution towards others who may be sick or injured and immediately reporting any safety issues to appropriate authorities.



RESPONSIBILITIES TO ABIDE BY THE FAIR PLAY CODE OF CONDUCT

SPORT & RECREATION ASSOCIATIONS AND CLUBS

Promote, and establish processes to comply with and enforce, the code. Ensure members have access to and agree to abide by the code.

OFFICIAL OR VOLUNTEER

Be informed about, abide by, promote and recognise compliance with, the code

PLAYER OR PARTICIPANT

Be informed about the implications of the code on participation, rights and obligations and abide by the code

PARENT

Educate children about the importance of demonstrating code behaviours and model these behaviours at all times.

SPECTATOR

Abide by the code when attending sports competitions within the Gascoyne Games.

MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC

Abide by the code when attending sports competitions within the Gascoyne Games.
