In the lead-up to our summer fortnightly movie afternoons, the library is presenting its first free movie:

"IN LIKE FLYNN"

This 'mostly true' tale of Errol Flynn's early days, inspired by his autobiography "Beam Ends", depicts a man more akin to the heroes he later came to portray in Hollywood.

Set in 1930, Errol uncovers a lead to a fortune in gold while serving as a jungle guide in Papua New Guinea for a movie producer. Back on the streets of Depression-era Sydney, Flynn rounds up a ragtag crew, steals a yacht (which happens to belong to Chinese Opium smugglers) and sets sail to find the gold. The voyage is fraught with corruption, thugs, tragedy, and of course, the smugglers looking for their 'stash'.




COMMUNITY JIGSAW PUZZLE

She settles with her husband in Henley street, Stratford, and has three children: a daughter, Susanna, and then twins, Hamnet and Judith. The boy, Hamnet, dies in 1596, aged 11. Four years or so later, the husband writes a play called 'Hamlet'.

Yes, Agnes is also known as Anne Hathaway, and her husband....William Shakespeare. This book provides an unforgettable vindication of Agnes and her story of loss, a woman intriguingly absent from history.
